

CIr Norris

The Lower Shoalhaven River CMP is on exhibition until 10th February.

Clr Norris is arranging support for the grant to rebuild the Wharf Road Boar ramp.

The budget for 2025/2026 has a focus on road repairs which Clr Norris is pleased to see.

Mayor Patricia White

Bolong road near Manildra – Mayor has written to the owner of Manildra Mr Honan asking for a time-frame for repairs. Understanding is that they will be ready to start within 2 weeks. Mr Honan is calling to see Mayor White on Thursday 6th February @ 3pm. There is further works to be done near the railway crossing which will mean the road will be fully closed for 2 weeks while the works are done. An alternative access via Hannigans Lane will be provided.

Wells Place modified Development Subdivision - noted that a report on the DA modification has been prepared by staff and will be presented to the March council meeting.

The Finance Committee is reviewing all business operations of Council and minutes have been reviewed and will go to the 18th February meeting of Council due to visitors to Council. A further Council meeting will be on 28th February. Mayor White encouraged all to watch for the reports.

The Community Strategic Plan and Delivery Program and Operational Plan will be on public exhibition shortly after being sent to the office of Local Government.

A Community Plan for Consultation will be on public exhibition shortly – this details what notifications are given when Development Applications are lodged.

The Budget process is starting shortly for 25/26 again a document to review.

Council has lodged the Special Rate Variation request with IPART for a 12% rate rise, outcome will be known in May.

Cir Selena Clancy

Clr Clancy thanked the Lions Club and Community Centre Management on behalf of Disaster Relief Australia with the flood debris clean up. DRA may be able to return to assist with the removal of the debris and this is being considered by DRA. It seems Council has not accepted this responsibility which is disappointing

Wells Place Subdivision Development Modification

The plan was circulated with the Agenda. A resident of Wells Place provided the background to the modification and made the following points:

The original subdivision was approved in 1985, 5 lots and one reserve. The reserve is at the end of Wells Place and is valued by the residents of that area. The reserve under the proposed modification would move to front Shoalhaven Heads Road and prevent access for the residents of Wells Place.

The area has underground electricity and hardedge kerb and guttering, and a restriction of a single driveway. The area is an overflow parking area for the sporting complex on Vic Zealand Oval when traffic congestion occurs.

The modification lists 400ml of fill will be placed on the lower land and runoff will go into the caravan park. The Forum is writing to Council to raise concerns

regarding the relocation of the reserve and the traffic impost if no access is available from Shoalhaven Heads road to take some of the traffic.

A resident of the adjacent Caravan Park spoke about mowing maintenance being done by Tall Timbers staff on the reserve which he felt was an impost. The resident was in favour of the development and is hoping that when developed the water issue he is getting will be solved. The water is coming from a property in Scott Street with no connection to the development. Mark Wells advised at this point the reserve is private property; however, once gazetted as a public reserve a park care group could be formed to maintain the space.

Another resident expressed a concern that if the community is anti-development this will stop the village growing.

Lower Shoalhaven River Coastal Management Program

The Forum sincerely thanked Claude Domio for his dedication in representing the community on the CMP committee. The Forum supports the adoption of the Lower Shoalhaven River CMP, noting that this does not include support for the Shoalhaven River Entrance Management Plan for Flood Mitigation which has not yet been released to the community, subject to the following items which have been spoken about for the past 4-5 years as important to the village:

- The inclusion of an item for Sand Scraping as recommended by MHL as a mechanism for repairing erosion caused by the storm water drains along the River Road bank and that appropriate permits be obtained to allow this action.
- The inclusion of dredging as an option to address the build-up of the sand flats west of the entrance area to facilitate a workable entrance opening strategy to mitigate against flooding.
- The inclusion of the appropriate permit to allow the continuation of the removal of mangroves from the unique small area in front of the Council caravan park on River Road Reserve. This area allows children, the elderly, people with a disability as well as others to access the shallow water and flats in a safe manner and removal is supported by local community groups and Riverwatch.
- The deletion of the Living Shoreline concept which was inserted into the CMP by the contractor Rhelm as an alternative to the removal of the mangroves,

costed by Rhelm at \$1.96m and which removes access to the shallow water and sand flats from recreational use of the community.

- The inclusion of an action to have a Management Plan drawn up to cover the Coastal Swamp near the Council Caravan Park. This is a very special coastal swamp which houses birds and wildlife and requires rehabilitation and protection.
- All other items which Claude has documented regarding water quality, drainage and other matters being reviewed and revised to Claude's satisfaction.

Member for Kiama Gareth Ward

Gareth has been advised that at this stage the David Berry Hospital services will close in 2026 with the government indicating a use as possible social housing. The strong view of the community is that the facility should still be used for palliative care and rehabilitation. This would take the strain off the Nowra Hospital and ensure patients have choice. The government has indicated this is a two-stage process and another round of consultation will occur. Gareth will follow this closely.

Gareth congratulated the Mayor and new Councillors and added that the Council is a different place to deal with under the new leadership.

Trains - Gareth is continuing to push hard for a passing loop to allow better scheduling. 81% of people who responded to the petition on satisfaction of the train service were unsatisfied with the service.

Thank you to those who signed the petition on removing the speed camera on Bolong Road - speed cameras should be in high traffic areas only - not as revenue raising opportunities.

Jervis Bay Road intersection is on time and on budget - this intersection has been the site of a number of accidents and is high priority for Gareth.

Gidg raised the issue of luggage compartments or sufficient space on the trains as the trip to the airport sees many people with luggage with nowhere to store it - Gareth took this on notice.

Robyn raised the issue of flooding and entrance management at Shoalhaven Heads. The existing strategy of opening the river entrance when the village is already in flood is flawed and the State Government need to be briefed on the safety issues. Gareth will follow up (Gareth has requested a meeting with the Minister and residents to present the case).

SHOALHAVEN RIVER ENTRANCE MANAGEMENT REVIEW **LEAVES RESIDENTS FRUSTRATED**

The draft Shoalhaven River Entrance Management Plan (EMP) Trigger Level Review has confirmed that scour depths across various studies: trigger levels will not be changed, maintaining the 2.0m AHD level at the Heads and 3.0m AHD at Nowra Bridge. The review concludes that lowering the trigger to 1.5m AHD would provide minimal flood relief, estimating only a 6cm reduction in peak flood levels.

Models Inconsistent with Historical Data

The decision to keep the current trigger levels is based on modelling assumptions that Berry's Canal remains the dominant flood outlet, and that entrance scouring follows a fixed-rate deepening process, regardless of when the entrance is opened. However, this conclusion is at odds with historical records, which show that when the entrance was already open before past floods, peak levels at Shoalhaven Heads remained at or below 1.5m AHD. While not directly comparable, this suggests that the model may underestimate the flood reduction benefits of opening the entrance earlier, especially if scouring occurs more rapidly than assumed. **Discrepancies in Draft Plan**

A key discrepancy in the review is its claim that water levels at 1.7m AHD will always continue to 2.0m AHD, which did not occur in June 2024, when it reached only 1.714m AHD. This contradicts the assumption that 1.7m is always a precursor to 2.0m, raising questions about whether opening the entrance at a lower level could have prevented further flooding in cases like this.

Additionally, there is a clear difference in reported

- Older reports (1984, 1986) suggested that scouring could deepen significantly beyond -4.0m AHD, with the 1984 report estimating potential deepening to -8.0m AHD in certain conditions.
- The newer models (2022, 2024) cap scour depth at -3.5m AHD, assuming a slower deepening process.
- Some local accounts suggest that scouring has reached depths of up to 7m, though this is not reflected in the modelling or official records.

Plan doesn't address major issues

Residents remain frustrated that the EMP does not address the visible impacts of flooding at 1.7m AHD, such as debris, silt, and property damage, which occur well before the 2.0m trigger is reached. The decision to maintain current trigger levels does not align with community concerns, nor does it fully explain why historical open-entrance floods have resulted in much lower peak levels than the model predicts.

Call for community to check documents

Once the full EMP review documents become available, residents are encouraged to read them carefully to identify any further discrepancies or overlooked issues. These reports will guide future entrance management decisions, and any inconsistencies or concerns need to be raised before the plan is finalised.


NATIVE BOTANIC GARDENS

WELLS PLACE SUBDIVISION

A long-dormant subdivision project in Shoalhaven Heads has resurfaced, igniting community debate over its relevance and potential impacts. The Wells Place subdivision, originally approved in 1983, remained largely undeveloped for decades. Now, developers are seeking to modify the original plans, prompting discussions about "zombie" development applications and environmental concerns.

Background of the Development

In 1983, a 27-lot subdivision was approved for Wells Place. The first stage concluded in 1985, but the second stage—comprising six lots (Lots 22-27)—was never developed. Despite the prolonged inactivity, the original development consent remains valid, allowing construction under the initial terms.

Understanding "Zombie" Development Applications

The term "zombie" development applications (DAs) refers to projects approved under outdated planning controls that remain unbuilt yet retain valid consent. These dormant approvals can resurface, permitting developments that may not align with current environmental standards or community expectations. In New South Wales, such "zombie" DAs have become a topic of concern, as they can bypass contemporary planning assessments.

Proposed Modifications

The current modification application (MA2024/1134) proposes several key changes:

- Lot Layout Adjustments: Reconfiguring the six lots for improved development feasibility.
- Relocation of the Public Reserve: Moving the designated public reserve from the end of Wells Place to Shoalhaven Heads Road.
- Road and Driveway Changes: Eliminating the need for a right-of-carriageway easement by consolidating access via Wells Place.
- Flood and Stormwater Management: Introducing over 1,500 cubic meters of fill to elevate the land

to meet the 1% Annual Exceedance Probability (AEP) flood level. This significant addition of fill raises concerns about the displacement of floodwaters, potentially affecting adjacent properties.

Community Concerns

Residents and the Shoalhaven Heads Community Forum have expressed several concerns:

- Validity of the Original Approval: Given the 40-year gap, many question whether the original consent should still be applicable, especially since it predates current planning and environmental standards.
- Flooding and Environmental Impact: The introduction of substantial fill could displace floodwaters, increasing the risk to nearby properties. Developing in flood-prone areas can exacerbate flooding, as natural water-


surfaces, leaving excess water with nowhere to go.

- Increased Traffic on Wells Place: Directing all new traffic onto this narrow cul-de-sac may lead to congestion and safety issues.
- Loss of Accessible Green Space: The community has utilised the original reserve location for decades. Relocating it to a busier road with limited parking is seen as detrimental to community access and safety.

Council and Agency Feedback

Shoalhaven City Council is currently reviewing the proposal, with input from various departments:

- Flood Management: Supports elevating the lots to meet flood standards but notes concerns about potential water displacement affecting neighbouring areas.
 - Development Engineering: Highlights issues re-

Next Steps

Residents are encouraged to stay informed and participate in the consultation process to ensure that any development aligns with community interests and current standards.



"We are hoping to upgrade equipment and facilities in our kitchen in the near future and \$2000 will give us a boost to get started.







NO TIME TO MISS OUT ON TASTE



The other night we found ourselves looking around for something for the evening meal and there wasn't a lot in the larder.

A couple of chicken breasts with a looming use-by date, a tin of tomatoes and a half empty packet of pasta.

From the pantry regulars we had our recently replenished store of garlic and half a packet of bread crumbs and from the garden, a lush basil bush.

Some people might see famine, but we saw a feast. The ingredients were there for a crunchy, crumbed chicken fillet on a bed of pasta, topped with a garlicky

This is how you do it.

Last-minute chicken and pasta with quick tomato sauce

tomato sauce garnished with fresh basil.

Ingredients Chicken

- 2 chicken breasts sliced horizontally
- 2-3 tblspns plain flour
- 1 tsp paprika
- 1 pinch salt
- 1 pinch pepper
- 1 egg, beaten
- ¾ cup bread crumbs 2 tblspns oil (neutral flavour is

Quick sauce

- 1-2 garlic cloves minced
- 1 tblspn extra virgin olive oil 400g tin of crushed tomatoes
- Handful torn basil leaves. Have some more to use as garnish.
- Salt, pepper to taste

Pasta

- 1-2 cups pasta shells, spirals or whatever is in the pantry
- Water

Method

To crumb the chicken, mix flour, paprika, salt and pepper on a plate. On another plate spread the bread crumbs. Place the bowl of egg mixture between the flour and breadcrumbs.

Using the tips of two fingers and your thumb pick up a chicken fillet and dredge it thoroughly in the flour. Dunk in the egg mixture and then press both side down into the breadcrumbs until completely coated. Place crumbed fillets onto a board and keep near the frypan.



Bring the pasta water to the boil. While this is happening mince the garlic, or use a crusher. Fry in a saucepan with the oil until garlic starts to change colour then dump in the tomatoes and add salt and pepper. You'll know how much. Stir occasionally while cooking over a medium heat.

When the water boils add salt and pasta. Cook for amount of time recommended on the packet.

The sauce and pasta will be ready at the same time. The chicken breasts will need 3-4 minutes a side.

Meanwhile heat a fry pan to moderate heat add the oil and fry the chicken breasts. Cook both sides until a good golden colour, usually about 3-4 minutes a side.

Everything should be ready about the same time.

To serve place chicken breasts on the pasta. Throw a handful of torn basil into the sauce, stir, then spoon some over the pasta.

Top with a chicken breast or two and drizzle a bit more sauce over the top. Tear up more basil leaves and scatter over the top for more flavour and colour.

Served: 2 hungry people, but could do 4.

NOTE: If you don't have chicken, some cooked sausage could go into the sauce. Or fry up pieces of halloumi or tofu. Maybe some left over cooked meat could be used.

Another talking point was a spiced hazy IPA that paired remarkably well with the roast lamb on offer.



One thing was clear—keeping the alcohol content in check meant everyone made it home without incident. Unlike those stronger commercial brews that can creep up on you, there were no reports of pushbike crashes, wrong door mix-ups, or waking up in an unfamiliar house. With that success in mind, plans are already underway for the next meeting.

WILDLIFE MATTERS - WHY IS THERE A SEAL ON THE BEACH?

It is not uncommon to see seals lazing on our beaches along the South Coast. Understandably, we may be concerned that they are injured or ill. However, often there is no need to worry.

These Pinniped (winged footed) seals are "hauling out", looking for a relaxing stay on the beach for days or sometimes weeks.

They often appear to be lethargic, yet they are usually seeking rest or some thermo-regulation.

They may need to warm their bodies on the sand or cool themselves in the ocean or river by raising their flippers in the air. Flippers contain many blood vessels which circulate warmed or cooled blood through their bodies to maintain adequate body temperatures.

Whilst we may be worry about our wildlife, National Parks Vets advise that we do not approach the seals any closer than 30 metres, both on land and in the water. Specific restrictions apply to jet-skis, motorboats, kayaks and paddle boards. Steep fines will apply to breach-



ing these laws.

It is also best to keep your domestic animals away because seals can move very quickly and give you or your dog a nasty bite. They should also be allowed to re-enter the sea where they will quickly retreat if threatened. Remember, "A yawn is a warning".

Enjoy our wildlife from a safe distance and call OR-RCA on 02 9415 3333 if you are concerned.

So next time you see a seal, enjoy them up close, but not too personal.


